Dear Friends,
East Windsor has lots of news updates regarding *road*way improvements.

Improvements to Stockton Street curbs and sidewalks between Route 130 and Oak Lane, a joint East Windsor Township and Hightstown Borough improvement project, are underway anticipated to be completed no later than Labor Day. Stockton Street is closed to through traffic on workdays Monday through Friday from 9 am to 3 pm, for

the replacement of existing curbs and sidewalks, driveway aprons, handicapped ramps where needed on Stockton Street between Route 130 and Oak Lane.

East Windsor has awarded the contract for the resurfacing of the remaining streets in **Brooktree neighborhood**, specifically Edwards Drive, Lynnfield Drive, Poplar Run and a portion of Maple Stream Road, to low bidder, Earle Asphalt, Jackson, NJ. The tentative schedule is to perform the concrete work starting in mid-september and complete all milling and resurfacing by the end of October.

East Windsor received \$950,000 NJ Department of Transportation grant for roadway improvements in Cranbury Manor, for Greenbrook Drive, Hope Valley Drive, Marilyn Drive, Meadowview Drive and Oakridge Road from Pinehurst to Greenbrook. The project includes the milling and resurfacing of these roadways, as well as other associated improvements to concrete curbing and aprons, handicap ramps, and stormwater inlets.


East Windsor has received two separate grants, \$258,860 and \$950,000 from NJ Department of Transportation for roadway improvements to the *remaining* Beechcroft area streets, specifically Beechcroft Drive, Hemlock Court, Brooklawn Drive, Ivy Lane East, Glenwood Circle and Meadowbrook Drive. The project includes the milling and resurfacing of these roadways, as well as other associated improvements to concrete curbing and aprons, handicap ramps, and stormwater inlets. For both roadway projects, the Township is in the process of retaining an engineer, and the roadway work is planned for 2024.

The Township also is in the process of significant improvements to Anker Park, prominently located across from the Lee Turkey Farm. Currently repairs and restoration are underway to the Brooktree Pathway, the paved multi-use path that runs parallel to Hickory Corner Road and Brooktree Road, providing access to Anker Park and the library branch. The Township has purchased brand new play equipment for Anker Park, which will be installed during August.

Plastic Film Recycling

Recycling Event

Saturday, September 30 from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M.,

East Windsor Township Is Holding <u>Document Shredding and Electronics Recycling</u> <u>Event</u>, Rain or Shine, at the East Windsor Senior Center (40 Lanning Boulevard).

This Township event, sponsored by Mayor Janice S. Mironov and Council Members, will offer *Free* document shredding to East Windsor residents (no commercial drop-offs are permitted), with a limit of ten boxes per household, and until the shredding truck is full. Electronic recycling is limited to televisions, computers and accessories, monitors, fax machines, VCR's, cable boxes and telephones. Residents will also be able to dispose of **fluorescent bulbs** and household batteries. East Windsor also is participating in the Trex's **Plastic Film Recycling Challenge**. The types of **plastic film** which can be dropped off for recycling are: grocery bags, bread bags, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, plastic shipping envelopes, Ziploc and other reclosable food storage bags, cereal bags, case overwrap, salt bags, pallet wrap and stretch film, wood pellet bags and produce bags. For every 500 pounds collected over six months, Trex donates a bench to the community. **RISE** will have trucks on-site to collect clothing, shoes, blankets, housewares (plates, mugs and related items), working appliances, household electronics and usable furniture. Clothing should be brought in plastic bags. **Residents must remain in their vehicles at all times**. For further information, call (609) 443-4000, ext. 215.

Senior Freeze - Property Tax Reimbursement



The Senior Freeze Program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for <u>property tax</u> or <u>mobile home park site</u> <u>fee</u> increases on their <u>principal residence</u> (main home). To qualify, you must meet all the <u>eligibility requirements</u> for each year from the <u>base year</u> through the application year.

2022 Senior Freeze Applications

We will begin mailing 2022 Senior Freeze blue booklets in mid-February, continuing throughout the month. Please allow until mid-March for delivery before contacting us. We mail PTR-1 booklets to homeowners who may qualify and preprinted PTR-2 booklets to eligible homeowners who applied last year. In addition, PTR-1 and some PTR-2 forms are available online.

The deadline for 2022 applications is October 31, 2023.







Flower Pounding

Thursday, August 24 1:00 pm

Flower Pounding is an ancient Cherokee art. The dye and the shape of flowers and foliage are hammered into a specially treated natural fabric; (wool, linen, cotton or silk). The Cherokee Indians used "pot ash" as a mordant, in order for the material to accept the dye of the plants and keep the colors bright.

Today, a mordant bath of; aluminum sulfate, washing soda and cream of tartar is used to treat the fabrics. The results are ASTOUNDING and INSTANT! When the piece is done, it resembles a watercolor. Each plant transfers in a unique and different way. A red rose may come out to look like a deep purple!

There is one caveat. The fabric cannot be washed, but you can dry clean it. This will set the color even more. The great news is that you don't need to be an artist in order to create one of these beauties!
