Dear Friends,

East Windsor kicked off the 2023 New Year with our **Annual Reorganization** meeting, and looking forward to another year with my colleagues, **Council Members** Denise Daniels, Marc Lippman, Alan Rosenberg, David Russell, Peter Yeager and John Zoller. Many great **volunteers who serve on Township boards and committees** were recog-

nized and thanked for their service.

East Windsor 2021 Business Awards were presented in late 2022 to Holiday Inn and National Conference Center, Modway and Moonshot Farm. The purpose of the annual award program is to recognize local businesses which have made special efforts to improve or contribute to the community.

<u>Holiday Inn and National Convention Center</u>, recognized for "Business Beautification," performed extensive renovations to the interior and exterior of their facility, resulting in a modernized upgraded looking facility for their guests and visitors to the East Windsor area. The Holiday Inn, an IHG Hotel located off New Jersey Turnpike East Windsor Exit 8, has 201 guest rooms, a popular statewide used 14,000 square foot National Conference Center, a full-service restaurant, bridal suite, ballroom, outdoor seating, business center, a fitness facility and an outdoor pool.

<u>Modway</u>, located on the redeveloped former National Lead site on Wyckoff Mills Road and highly visible from the NJ Turnpike, was recognized for "Community Service/Sustainable Green Practices." Modway, a furniture designer and supplier company, stepped up with the food needs during the pandemic and partnered with RISE and the Trenton Area Soup Kitchen to host food distribution events and has continued to demonstrate their commitment to the community. Modway also has installed major solar rooftop arrays, to provide a significant amount of their company energy needs and promote clean energy.

Moonshot Farm, recognized for "Community Enhancement," is a family-owned cut flower farm on Imlaystown Road, launched in 2019, which specializes in bee-friendly cut flowers sustainably grown without chemical herbicides or pesticides, raw honey, pasture-raised rainbow eggs, make-your-own floral arrangement and holiday wreath classes and private events. MoonShot Farm also offers a pick-your-own flowers, a Crop Share Agreement (CSA) in which residents can buy a piece of land and grow their own flowers and sponsors a popular Bouquet-of-the-month Club subscription of 3 or 6 months, DIY wreath kits and holiday gift boxes.

On December 4, 1956, Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis, Carl Perkins and Elvis Presley assemble at the Sun Record recording studio in Memphis, Tennessee.

Established performer Carl Perkins was to record songs with a new performer, Jerry Lee Lewis. Elvis Presley stops by the studio along with his girlfriend, a singer named Dyanne. Johnny Cash has stopped by to talk to recording impresario Sam Philips. They soon have a jam session together. Philips attempts to re-sign John-



ny Cash to a new contract, unaware he has already signed with Columbia Records. Typically, as a member from the Quartet enters for the first time, he sings a verse of one of his most famous songs, followed by an onstage freeze of all actors. During this time Sam Philips relates to the audience how he first discovered the boy, and a brief, few line scene of that moment occurs between Philips and the musician, followed by Sam Phillips asking the boy to play something for him, which is the next verse of the song, and everyone unfreezes.




