IMPORTANT FINAL REMINDER: New Property Tax

Relief Program Application Filing Deadline Extended to <u>Tuesday</u>, February 28, <u>2023</u>. The Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners and Renters (ANCHOR) program replaces the Homestead Benefit program and expands the amount of property tax relief and number of eligible homeowners and tenants.



Senior Freeze - Property Tax Reimbursement



The Senior Freeze Program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for <u>property tax</u> or <u>mobile home park site</u> <u>fee</u> increases on their <u>principal residence</u> (main home). To qualify, you must meet all the <u>eligibility requirements</u> for each year from the <u>base year</u> through the application year.

2022 Senior Freeze Applications

We will begin mailing 2022 Senior Freeze blue booklets in mid-February, continuing throughout the month. Please allow until mid-March for delivery before contacting us. We mail PTR-1 booklets to homeowners who may qualify and preprinted PTR-2 booklets to eligible homeowners who applied last year. In addition, PTR-1 and some PTR-2 forms are available online.

The deadline for 2022 applications is October 31, 2023.

On December 4, 1956, Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis, Carl Perkins and Elvis Presley assemble at the Sun Record recording studio in Memphis, Tennessee.

Established performer Carl Perkins was to record songs with a new performer, Jerry Lee Lewis. Elvis Presley stops by the studio along with his girlfriend, a singer named Dyanne. Johnny Cash has stopped by to talk to recording impresario Sam Philips. They soon have a jam session together. Philips attempts to re-sign John-



ny Cash to a new contract, unaware he has already signed with Columbia Records. Typically, as a member from the Quartet enters for the first time, he sings a verse of one of his most famous songs, followed by an onstage freeze of all actors. During this time Sam Philips relates to the audience how he first discovered the boy, and a brief, few line scene of that moment occurs between Philips and the musician, followed by Sam Phillips asking the boy to play something for him, which is the next verse of the song, and everyone unfreezes.



"Ident-Adult" is an emergency identification card provided by the Sheriff's Office, specifically for senior citizens.

The card contains your name, address, telephone number, whom to contact in a medical emergency, doctor's name and phone number, illnesses, and allergies. Should a senior become incapacitated by sudden illness and cannot speak or remember, the Ident-Adult card can speak for the cardholder, providing vital contact and medical information.

Years ago, original cards contained a place for the thumbprint, but with improvements in technology, a photograph replaced the thumbprint of the cardholder.


