<u>Tuesday, November 7 is Election Day</u>, for the entire NJ Legislature, Mercer County offices and East Windsor Council. If you have applied to **Vote by Mail**, look out for your ballot, complete it, and return it by mail or place in the local **Dropbox** at the *Police/Court Building at 80 One Mile Road*. You also can **Vote Early in Person** from **October 28 thru November 7**, Monday – Saturday from 10am to 8 pm and Sunday 10am to 6 pm at the **Hickory Corner Library** (138 Hickory Corner Road) or any early voting location in Mercer County.


Getinge, Global Life Science Company, will occupy the entire newly constructed 167,500 SF building in the Innovation Park Complex on Princeton-Hightstown Road. Getinge, founded in Sweden in 1904, is a global medical device technology company which provides innovative equipment and systems to healthcare industries, to increase productivity and to improve peoples' quality of life and save lives. The company has over 11,000 employees in 40 countries and centers in France, China, Germany, Poland, Sweden, Turkey, Netherlands and the United Kingdom. The newly constructed modern *Innovation Park*, on 86.97 acres formerly occupied by McGraw Hill and comprised of two buildings, is designed to attract innovative high-tech business and incorporates modern unique architectural features and extensive outdoor green areas, benches and a walking pathway.

East Windsor was awarded \$1.3 Million state funds for Parks and Recreation. The Township will use the grant funds toward park improvements notably restoration of the Brooktree Pathway and purchase of new play equipment for Anker Park. The Township also is considering outdoor recreation amenities for the Senior Center enabling seniors to enjoy more programs and fun outdoors together, as a large pavilion allowing outdoor classes and socializing, shuffleboard and/or bocce court and/or horseshoes, cornholes, and chess and checker tables.

Work has begun to resurface the remaining **Brooktree neighborhood streets**, **Edwards**, **Lynnfield**, **Poplar Run and Maple Stream**, with completion by late October. Engineering contracts have been awarded for roadway improvements in **Cranbury Manor** (\$950,000 state grant) and **Beechcroft area** (\$833,860 state grant), with roadway work planned for 2024.

Fraud Education

The fake Invoice Scam

Let's start with arguably the most popular phishing template out there - the fake invoice technique. Like many phishing attacks, this scam relies on fear and urgency, pressuring an end user to submit a payment for goods or services they've never even ordered or received.

Terminology: Phishing

The fraudulent practice of sending emails or other messages purporting to be from reputable companies in order to induce individuals to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit card numbers.

Example:

From: xero@gmail.com

Sent: Tuesday, 20 June 2017 12:09 p.m. Subject: Your xero invoice available now

Hi,

Thanks for working with us. Your bill for \$373.75 was due on August 28, 2016. If you've already paid it, please ignore this email and sorry for bothering you. If you've not paid it, please do so as soon as possible to avoid further action from us.

If you've got any questions, or want to arrange alternative payment don't hesitate to get in touch.

Red Flags:

- ♦ Email address is "gmail." If this was a legit company, the email address would reflect the company name.
- ♦ You have never done business with this company.
- ◆ Unprofessional grammar.

What to do: Of course we want to delete this immediately. You can also google the company and/or the email address that sent the email. It is likely google info will tell you that this is a common scam.
