Please join us at <u>East Windsor Ceremony for Anniversary of 9/11</u> on Monday, September 11 at 5 P.M. to remember and honor the anniversary of September 11. The ceremony will take place at the existing 9/11 Memorial located on the grounds of the East Windsor Township Municipal Building (16 Lanning Boulevard).

East Windsor Is Holding Document Shredding and Electronics Recycling Event on Saturday, September 30 from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M., Rain or Shine, at the Senior Center. This Township event, sponsored by Mayor and Council Members, offers *Free* **document shredding to East Windsor residents (no commercial drop-offs are permitted), with a limit of ten boxes per household, and** *until the shredding truck is full.* **Drop off of electronics** as televisions, computers and accessories and other items, as well as fluorescent bulbs and household batteries. **RISE** will have trucks on-site to collect clothing, shoes, blankets, housewares (plates, mugs and related items), working appliances, household electronics and usable furniture. Residents also can recycle **Plastic Film** which includes: grocery bags, bread bags, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, plastic shipping envelopes, reclosable food storage bags, cereal bags, case overwrap, salt bags, pallet wrap and stretch film, wood pellet bags and produce bags. Recycling equals **Green** for the environment and saves money.

Joint East Windsor Hightstown improvements to **Stockton Street Curbs and Sidewalks Between Route 130** and Oak Lane were completed in August, and Mercer County subsequently finished milling and repaving of Stockton Street (County Route 571).

East Windsor awarded the contract for the resurfacing of the remaining streets in **Brooktree neighborhood**, **specifically Edwards Drive**, **Lynnfield Drive**, **Poplar Run and a portion of Maple Stream Road**. The work schedule is beginning the concrete work in mid-September and complete all milling and resurfacing by the end of October.

SPECIAL NOTICE: TAX BILLS, originally due Third Quarter, August 1 were **DELAYED** due to hold up with the **adoption of the Mercer County budget**, and the inability to certify a final tax rate. **Keep posted for updates this month.**



Recycling Event Saturday, September 30 from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M.,

East Windsor Township Is Holding <u>Document Shredding and Electronics Recycling</u> <u>Event</u>, Rain or Shine, at the East Windsor Senior Center (40 Lanning Boulevard).

This Township event, sponsored by Mayor Janice S. Mironov and Council Members, will offer *Free* document shredding to East Windsor residents (no commercial drop-offs are permitted), with a limit of ten boxes per household, and until the shredding truck is full. Electronic recycling is limited to televisions, computers and accessories, monitors, fax machines, VCR's, cable boxes and telephones. Residents will also be able to dispose of **fluorescent bulbs and household batteries**. East Windsor also is participating in the Trex's **Plastic Film Recycling Challenge**. The types of **plastic film** which can be dropped off for recycling are: grocery bags, bread bags, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, plastic shipping envelopes, Ziploc and other reclosable food storage bags, cereal bags, case overwrap, salt bags, pallet wrap and stretch film, wood pellet bags and produce bags. For every 500 pounds collected over six months, Trex donates a bench to the community. **RISE** will have trucks on-site to collect clothing, shoes, blankets, housewares (plates, mugs and related items), working appliances, household electronics and usable furniture. Clothing should be brought in plastic bags. **Residents must remain in their vehicles at all times**. For further information, call (609) 443-4000, ext. 215.
